Graduation 2019:

As the class of 2019 prepares to graduate, our Executive Director Sean Anthony has been leading the admissions process for the class of 2020. We have capacity to accept 38 students this year, and will accept nominations through the end of this week, April 19th. The class of 2020 will start their journey on June 3rd at 8:30 am.

Classroom Progress:

At this time of the year, with just a few weeks left before graduation, our students have completed the core components of the Base Camp curriculum. At the end of March the full class was promoted through the third evaluation gate, and moved on to their thesis projects. This year each student completed two Java-based group projects using Agile methodology for managing their team work. With the classroom instructors and our Software Engineer in Residence acting as customers, the students went through the process of gathering requirements, regular progress updates and change requests, and final product delivery and feedback.

Spring is also the time for our students to prepare for, and engage in, finding and securing their first employment opportunity. The entire class spent a 40 hour week in March job shadowing in business offices across the state and in Birmingham. (A huge thank you to MorganWhite, CSpire, Corelogic, Renasant Bank, MTrade, and Elliott Logic.) Back in the classroom each student completed three practice technical interviews, with feedback and improvement notes to help them prepare for the real thing.

They are now working through their final projects, taking on the challenge of learning additional languages and frameworks based on the companies they are hoping to work with, and applying for positions and completing interviews as frequently as possible. In January Mr. Steven Goodgame brought his 6th grade Coding class from Lafayette County to allow them to sit with Base Camp students and do some hands on coding.



Ms. Kate Hooper donated a Professional Writing Workshop, with specific focus on writing structures and strategies to clearly and professionally communicate in a business environment.





It will also include office space for our corporate partners and space for a tech and tech adjacent start-up incubator.
